




Alyssa Garcia **RN: Antepartum**

This year, UMC received the Get With The Guidelines®-Stroke Gold Plus Achievement awards for Stroke Elite Plus Honor Roll. Type 2 Diabetes Honor Roll and Stroke Advanced Therapy Honor Roll.

The award given to comprehensive stroke that are able to achieve the highest level of quality metrics involving patient care and timing of treatments. Qualifications for the award were based on data compiled from January 2021 to December 2023.



West Texas Poison Center Celebrates 30 Years

What began as a small center that would only receive a couple of calls a day has grown to answering more than 85 calls regarding accidental medication poisonings, snake bites, insect stings and poisonous plants, on a daily basis.

A vital resource for our community, the West Texas Poison Center (WTPC) is celebrating 30 years of providing toxicology consultations that help avoid unnecessary trips to the emergency department and in some instances, saving lives.

On Sept. 1, 1994, WTPC began its operation at the R.E. Thomason General Hospital Inpatient Pharmacy, a year after the Texas Legislature established the Texas Poison Control Network. Three years later, The WTPC became the first bilingual (English and Spanish) poison center accredited by the American Association of Poison Control Centers.

Today, the WTPC is a comprehensive 24-hour poison center offering services to the public and healthcare professionals from across 36 counties of West Texas, to include El Paso, Midland/Odessa and San Angelo.

In 2023, WTPC accomplished an enormous feat, becoming 100-percent certified by the American Association of Poison Control Centers.

"Our Poison Center hotline is a vital resource not only for the residents of West Texas, but to the many healthcare professionals

who also call us for advice and guidance with their patients," said Dr. Salvador Baeza, Director of UMC's WTPC. "We look forward to serving our community for many more years."

The WTPC is an active teaching site for residents, interns and students from Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center El Paso, The University of Texas at El Paso's School of Pharmacy and William Beaumont Army Medical Center.

"It is incredible to me that something like this has been around for so long and has so much support from our facility, state, and federal government," said Isabel Hernandez-Fuerte, Poison Information Specialist. "I think there are a few places that have such universal support and are very accessible to the public, so I am happy to be a part of this team."

UMC Recognized By American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, Again!

UMC's Digestive Health Center and UMC Surgical Center West have earned a prestigious three-year recognition by the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ASGE) for promoting Quality and Safety in Endoscopy.

UMC was first awarded this recognition in 2015 and later in 2022.

The ASGE Endoscopy Unit Recognition Program (EURP) honoree status is earned for three years. This is the only program of its kind honoring GI endoscopy units that have demonstrated commitment to delivering high-quality, safe, patient-centered care.

Nurse's Testimony Helps Bring Justice To High-Profile Case In New Mexico

Karla Salazar, Certified Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) RN, was recognized by the Federal Investigations Bureau (FBI) in New Mexico for her testimony in the trial of a former high-level El Paso school district employee and former middle and elementary school teacher charged with kidnapping and sexually assaulting an El Paso woman.

Salazar's testimony and expertise as a SANE resulted in the perpetrator getting 30 years in prison.

"Ms. Salazar showed the victim immense compassion during one of the scariest times in the victim's life. She also testified masterfully at trial about her expertise in conducting SANE exams and about the SANE exam she conducted on the case," the FBI noted at a law enforcement awards ceremony.

University Medical Center of El Paso (UMC) has seven SANEs certified in pediatric, adult and adolescent exams.

"To conduct a sexual assault exam is not easy for the patient, the family or even the SANE because the victim has gone through so much already and they don't want to talk about it," explained Gloria Salazar, UMC's Trauma Education Prevention and SANE Manager. "Karla's documentation and her testimony resulted in a good outcome. This is one in a million, and I hope we see more of these outcomes because not all cases go to court."

UMC is the only local hospital to offer a SANE 24/7, something Salazar credits UMC's CEO for.

"We are thankful to Jacob Cintron because when he became CEO of UMC in 2017, he granted the full SANE program 24/7 and we are honored and lucky that we have a full SANE program for patients in our region, which covers parts of Texas, New Mexico and Mexico," said Salazar.

UMC's SANE program is available for anyone who may have questions about sexual assault, domestic violence or human trafficking. You can ask to speak to a SANE at UMC's Emergency Department.

Below are our FY24 Associate Engagement Organization Wide Results


FY24 Engagement Indicator

Faith over Fear

At a time where life stood still for me, and uncertainty was the only thing I could feel your Charitable care grant gave me some piece of mind and feeling that someone cared about what I was going through.

As a very independent person I have always taken care of myself financially. With my breast cancer diagnosis early last year the last thing I was thinking about was how my life was going to be impacted financially. In the beginning of the entire treatment process, I felt many doors closed for me as I did not qualify for many services because of the fact I live alone, I no longer have any dependents living with me and my income was enough to sustain me. Yet my employment hours had to be cut short because of the many procedures and treatments I had to go through. From chemotherapy, mastectomy and radiation my medical bills/copayments went so high I had to start prioritizing my bills. During this time all you want and pray is to have a positive outcome and a good prognosis.

When I was offered the grant my first reaction and my response to the person that contacted me was that I wouldn't qualify. I explained to her I didn't qualify for anything, yet she told me to turn in all required documents and they would follow the process for the grant, So I did.

I truly appreciate and I am forever grateful to have been a recipient of your grant. It helped me tremendously financially during a time when I was running out of options. I remember clearly it was on a Saturday morning early January 2024 when I picked up my mail from the mailbox. There was a letter from the hospital, and as I always do, I opened it to categorize it in my organizational basket and to my surprise it was not a bill but a check for me from your grant. It was like God had heard my prayers the night before. I sat on my couch and started to cry because I was at a point where I had no more options.

I am so grateful and thankful we have organizations like yours that make a difference in people's life that are going through this type of difficult situations. All I have gone through and endured has been a life lesson to me. I hope your organization continues to make a difference in people's life and my testimony can be one of many. Again, I am truly grateful and thank every single one of the people who contributed as it was a blessing in my life.

Dr. Alonzo has gone above and beyond and has done anything and everything he can to help me, if it wasn't for him, I don't think I would have ever received the care I have received.

Although, I realize I am not his only patient, and he is busy with many other patients, I am grateful and appreciate his time to care for me.

As we all know doctors are busy, but Dr. Alonzo been very helpful when he didn't have to, he went as far as to take the time out of his busy day to write a letter on my behalf. I am very thankful and grateful for his help with the letter which was done to help get me into pain management through Health Care Options/HCO's, since HCO's doesn't have a pain management doctor I was hoping they could still somehow get me to see a pain doctor, but this was a difficult process with HCO's. This led my mother to search online to see what other doctors treat pain & she had seen palliative doctor's treat pain, and to see & call. This led my mother to call Dr. Beccerra's office, they said he sees patients for pain and he would see me. Thankfully I went & saw Dr. Beccerra who has also been tremendously helpful in the care of my pain.

Dr. Alonzo has not once given up, he has instead said let's see, let's do this, try this and suggested referrals to see what they say. Dr. Alonzo has also referred me when I have left messages for his nurse letting him know what is going on and where the specialist wants me referred to since he has to be the one to refer me he has been open to their request.

If it wasn't for switching to Dr. Alonzo last year and having my first appointment with him July 3, 2023 I probably would still be stuck not getting anywhere with my prior provider and wondering if this is it, and all that can be done to help me.

Dr. Alonzo had shown there are still thing to do & try, and Doctors/Specialist to see, and if it wasn't for Dr. Alonzo referring me to Texas Tech Neurology again, which I believe for the 3rd time, I've been seen by them which then lead Neurology to do a full spine & head MRI's, in which I would not have know of the things occurring in my spine & brain, which unfortunately wasn't addressed by Neurology, but Dr. Alonzo has made sure that they have been addressed and it's being taken care of Dr. Alonzo is also the first doctor ever during the duration of my life to refer me to endocrinology, which has been very helpful so far.

Dr. Alonzo has done his absolute best to take great care of me, and listen to me, and do what is needed to figure and rule out my health problems. I will be forever grateful and thankful to him for his attentive and exceptional patient care, bedside manner, and for not giving up on me this past year.



TRAUMA TEAM EDUCATES ON VEHICLE SAFETY FOR KIDS

University Medical Center of El Paso's (UMC) Trauma Injury Prevention team set up several demonstrations at the El Paso Zoo as part of the "Safety Safari" event in July.

UMC's trauma team placed a thermometer inside a parked car with no air conditioning and watched as the temperature soared in a matter of minutes.

They explained to children and parents how small children are not able to regulate their body temperature as well as adults. A child can experience organ failure if they are left in a car with a temperature of 104-degrees. In this case, it only took 13 minutes for the car to reach that temperature.

In another demonstration, our trauma team had kids stand behind a parked truck and asked their parents to sit in the driver's seat and see if they could "spot their tot" through the rear-view mirror. Many were not able to see their child until they were standing more than 20-feet behind the truck.

This event was also a great opportunity for the community to learn about traffic safety and how to properly wear a helmet.


