UMC Introduces Da Vinci 5 Robot For Soft Tissue Surgical Procedures

University Medical Center of El Paso (UMC) became the only hospital in El Paso to implement the use of an advanced multiport robotic surgical system, called Da Vinci 5, by Intuitive, for soft tissue procedures in June.

This new robotic system introduces "force feedback technology," which allows surgeons to feel subtle forces exerted on tissue during surgery, creating less trauma on the tissue. The Da Vinci 5 robot uses cutting-edge data analytics to provide surgeons with high-quality 3D imaging and also has the capacity to incorporate Artificial Intelligence (AI).

UMC is the only hospital to use the to travel out of town for.

Da Vinci 5 robot in the El Paso or Las Cruces area. The closest hospital to use this type of technology can be found in Albuquerque.

Last year in April, UMC was the first hospital in El Paso to introduce the use of the Da Vinci SP (single port) robotic system, which gave surgeons the ability to deliver robotic-assisted surgery through a single port, instead of multiple ports, making surgeries less invasive.

Having access to these types of advanced systems allows UMC to continue offering the community services they otherwise would have to travel out of town for.

UMC Introduces New Mako Robot For Less Invasive Surgeries

University Medical Center of El Paso (UMC) continues its commitment to the community with the addition of a new state-of-the-art robotic system for hip and knee replacements. The Stryker Mako Robotic-Arm, for more accurate and precise joint replacements, is now being used at UMC Surgical Hospital to provide patients with less invasive options.

The Mako robot assists surgeons in creating a joint replacement that is near normal and functional by tailoring implants to the patient's anatomy.

Surgeons obtain real-time feedback and cues from the Mako Robotic-Arm during surgery, which allow surgeons to make adjustments to the surgical plan, if needed.

PAM Health, UMC Celebrate **Joint Venture With New Robots**

(UMC) and PAM Health Rehabilitative Hospital celebrated the one year anniversary of a joint venture, which was established May 2023, by introducing two state-of-the-art robots.

The Balo Dynamic Standing Frame and Tigo Motor-assisted Cycling Trainer, by Thera Trainer, can assist in the rehabilitation of patients who are recovering from a stroke, orthopedic surgery or an accident.

With the use of virtual gaming software, the Balo Dynamic Standing Frame is able to aid in strengthening patients' balance, coordination, and sensory re-introduction.

University Medical Center of El Paso A patient is strapped into the frame and faces a screen with virtual therapeutic gaming. The shock absorbers on the frame help patients shift their body weight in order to maneuverer the game, without the risk of falling.

> Tigo Motor-assisted Cycling Trainer can be used with a chair or wheelchair to facilitate movement of the upper and lower extremities and improve motor skills. This training device allows patients with limited mobility to exercise with assistance from the robotic features on the pedals.

> PAM Health has seen nearly 400 rehabilitation patients since the joint venture began with UMC.


UMC Surgical Center West Receives Recognition For Quality

Mother Gives Thanks To UMC, Finds Will To Live After Crash

Rosalia Mercado's story is proof that during our weakest moments, strength can come from within.

She discovered this power on March 7, 2010, after the vehicle she was in flipped several times, ejected her and changed her life at 18 years old.

Just nine months after having her first child, Rosalia had found herself in critical condition, her injuries so severe, she was transported to University Medical Center of El Paso for treatment.

"Visibly there were no injuries," said Rosalia. "There was no blood nor bruises, but I was not able to move, and I was losing consciousness."

For nine months, doctors and nurses at UMC worked tirelessly to stabilize Rosalia and keep her alive.

The crash had caused her cervical spine

to shatter and her lungs to collapse.

"There was a time when no one knew if I would make it." Rosalia recalled. She paused then said, "Eventually, I was diagnosed as a C4-C5 quadriplegic, paralyzed from the chest down."

Nonetheless, Rosalia went back to school in 2017, received her Associate of Arts degree from EPCC and started a virtual assistance and social media management business.

This spring, Rosalia has enrolled in a bachelor's degree program to continue her education, inspiring her son, Dominic, to do anything he sets his mind to, despite any limitations.

"Through it all, motherhood remains the greatest joy of my life. Those early years were tough on both of us. He could not understand why mommy was not there, but when I was stable enough, he would cuddle up next to me in my hospital bed. His presence gave me strength."

Rosalia said she has never let any limitations hold her back from being the best mom she could possibly be. She and her family now live every day with meaning, strength and faith.

She is filled with gratitude toward her family, who supported her through those early years, and for the healthcare professionals at UMC who not only helped save her life, but cared for her and made sure she was comfortable throughout the pain and uncertainty.

Rosalia's story is an inspiration to many, especially her sister, Claudia Mercado, who pursued a career in the healthcare field after Rosalia's experience and currently serves as Administrative Director of Clinic Operations at UMC.

This year's blood donor turnout nearly doubled last years with a total of 40 registrants.


UMC's Trauma Survivors Network works to help the community

UMC's Trauma Survivors Network supports patients with their resiliency, healing and adaptation to a traumatic injury and is currently the only hospital in the region that offers this program.



UMC Receives Generous Donation To Help Fund Cancer Care



The entire Porras family attended the unveiling naming ceremony for the new Gary G. and Mireille Porras Waiting Room.

At some point or another in their cancer journey, it is possible a patient has spent time in the Ambulatory Surgical Unit (ASU) waiting room at University Medical Center of El Paso.

It is in the ASU waiting room where patients await to have life-changing, and in some instances, life-saving procedures performed.

The significance of this area in the hospital resonated with the Porras family whose father, Gary G. Porras, lost his battle with pancreatic cancer in December 2020, a month after he was diagnosed with the disease.

"It happened so fast, but all the people who were involved with his diagnosis and care, their calling in life is very powerful," said Paul Porras, Gary's son.

"My family has been blessed, in that we've never had to deal with anyone in our immediate or extended family having cancer, so when we found

out about my father's diagnosis, it was a reality check that this disease exists and there are people who are suffering from it," Porras said.

Gary's memory and fight against cancer will forever live through a generous donation Paul and his wife, Cecilia, made to UMC's Sobreviviendo el Cancer program in his honor.

Now, as patients sit in this waiting room, they will gaze upon the Porras family's name, a reminder of the efforts being made to help save lives and make a difference in cancer care for the borderland.

The Gary G. and Mireille Porras Waiting Room was unveiled in June in honor of Gary and his wife, Mireille, on what would have been their 55th wedding anniversary.

The generosity of the Porras Family will significantly help ease the uncertainty and burden that families face after a cancer diagnosis, and that is something they said Gary would have wanted.

UMC Pharmacies Expand Services To Better Serve Entire Community

University Medical Center of El Paso (UMC) is introducing new ways to help customers get the medications they need easier and faster.

Patients can now request to refill their medication prescriptions through a new mobile app called RX365, available on the Apple App Sore or Google Play. The RX365 mobile app connects patients to seven UMC pharmacy locations across town for a more convenient way to stay up-todate with medications.

Using the mobile app allows users to easily view medications, request prescription refills, receive status

updates, chat with pharmacy staff and transfer prescriptions from other pharmacies.

Additionally, UMC has also expanded its prescription mail-order delivery service, which was previously only available at the UMC West Clinic Pharmacy, to all UMC pharmacies. This service is available for qualifying prescriptions Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for a cost of \$3 per package.

UMC's Powerhouse Receives Boost With Funding For Equipment

Uninterrupted power is essential at any hospital. At UMC, generators comprise the power-producing heart of the hospital, providing high-pressure steam, cooling and emergency power systems for the entire hospital.

"The generators at UMC have exceeded their recommended durability of 20 years," said Ivan Cabrera, Supv. Power Plant for UMC's Engineering Dept. "We've done a great job taking preventative measures to maintain the system." UMC's aging generators will be getting a boost thanks to Rep. Veronica Escobar of Texas who presented the hospital with a \$1.3 million check to go toward the replacement of UMC's 2.5MW emergency generator and the

addition of power storage and solar capacity for the hospital. The \$1.3 million is part of \$19 million in federal funds Congresswoman Escobar was able to secure through the federal Community Project Funding process for various El Paso improvement projects.

"Replacing these generators will allow us to give the current generators some much needed maintenance, so that we have a back up to the backup," said Cabrera.

Thank you, Congresswoman Escobar, for providing us with powerful funding that will allow UMC to continue uninterrupted care for our community during any emergency.






